If we agree, we should strive to write a thesis or paper that is clear and transparent at the same time. This workshop will cover some essential elements of writing - e.g. clarity through simplicity and conciseness - that are required for any academic text. However, it will also deal with transparency, here understood as the ideal of keeping academic texts accessible not only to experts in the field but to scholars of any field. Examples from academic texts will serve to illustrate how these two sometimes conflicting objectives can be approached.
